After escaping from an Eastern European concentration camp during World War II where he has spent most of his life, a 12-year-old boy struggles to cope with an entirely strange world as he flees northward to freedom in Denmark.

RUN, BOY, RUN

by Orlev, Uri

Based on the true story of a 9-year-old boy who escapes the Warsaw Ghetto and must survive throughout the war in the Nazi-occupied Polish countryside.

SNOW TREASURE

by McSwigean, Marie

In 1940, when the Nazi invasion of Norway reaches their village in the far north, 12-year-old Peter and his friends use their sleds to transport nine million dollars worth of gold bullion past the German soldiers to the secret harbor where Peter's uncle keeps his ship ready to take the gold for safekeeping in the United States.

9-year-old Helen is confused by the disappearance of her Jewish friend during the German occupation of Paris during World War II.

STONES IN WATER

During World War II, after being taken by German soldiers from a local movie theater along with other Italian boys including his Jewish friend, Roberto is forced to work in Germany, escapes into the Ukrainian winter, before desperately trying to make his way back home to Venice. Loosely based on the wartime experiences of a Venetian friend of the author.

THE ISLAND ON BIRD STREET

During World War II, a Jewish boy is left on his own for months in a ruined house in the Warsaw Ghetto, where he must learn all the tricks of survival under constantly life-threatening conditions.

TITANIC CROSSING

In 1912, 13-year-old Albert considers his younger sister a pest, but things change when they travel with their mother and uncle aboard the Titanic and are caught up in its tragic sinking.

TORN THREAD

by Isaacs, Anne

J FICTION ISA

In an attempt to save his daughter's life, Eva's father sends her from Poland to a labor camp in Czechoslovakia where she and her sister survive the war. Based on the true story of the author's mother-in-law during World War II.
