Chronicles the life of Lalu Nathoy, a young Chinese girl--sold as a slave and brought to America--where, later, as Polly Bemis she struggles and survives as a pioneer in the West.

A fictional portrait of Sojourner Truth chronicles her life amidst the hardships of slavery, from her separation from her family and sale to one master after another, to her lifelong crusade for abolition and women's rights. (Sojourner Truth)

Reluctantly entering the battle when Virginia settlers attack her tribe's homeland, Shawnee Women's Peace Chief Nonhelema works to negotiate an armistice with such individuals as Daniel Boone and George Rogers Clark, only to find herself estranged from her people and betrayed by her white adversaries.
