#### Misinformation:

### False or misleading information created/shared regardless of intent to deceive created/shared with intent to deceive

#### Disinformation:

False or misleading information knowingly

#### Information Disorders (<u>www.firstdraftnews.org</u>)

- 1. Satire or Parody: No intention to cause harm but has potential to fool.
- 2. <u>False Connection:</u> When headlines, visuals or captions don't support the content.
- 3. <u>Misleading Content:</u> Misleading use of information to frame an issue or individual.
- 4. False Context: When genuine content is shared with false contextual information.
- 5. <u>Imposter Content:</u> When genuine sources are impersonated.
- 6. <u>Manipulated Content:</u> Genuine information or imagery is manipulated to deceive.
- 7. Fabricated Content: New content that is 100% false, designed to deceive.

#### Mitigation Options

- Limit social media (as news source)
- Unfollow those perpetuating disorder
- Be slow to share
- Investigate and verify

#### **Investigation Questions**

- What's the original source?
- When did it happen?
- Who posted it?
- Why is it shared (motivation)?
